

A reserve study has been initiated and will be done within two weeks. This will professionally determine the condition of the common assets of the community (Clubhouse and grounds), and the approximate cost to rectify all the deferred maintenance. It also determines what items need our attention now and specific time intervals for maintenance. The study is mandated by law to be done every three years by an outside company and updated yearly by the board.

Our CC&R's and Bylaws are in process of being updated and we will have more information in the coming months.

We have been having trouble at the clubhouse with personal hygiene items, boxes of books, microwaves, love seat sofa, garage door opener hardware, and pieces of lumber that just appear in the lobby and around the property. "My grandfather, Jacob Bloch, was my hero. He was a gentle giant: an unshakable sequoia tree of a man, framed by silver hair and wire-rimmed glasses that wrapped behind his ears and hugged his face, a relic from another era. I can still feel the way he would gently walk me down the line of our local cafeteria, my tray perched just above my head. He spoke to each person we passed in line like he had stumbled upon a favorite long-lost cousin; he made them all feel counted, and he made me feel like I was in the very ce nter of a perfectly warm universe. It was my grandfather's intuitive nature to seek conversation with EVERYONE. From his warm and trusted perch at the cash register of his H. H. Bloch & Sons Department Store in Patterson, New York, he would listen to the stories of "soon to be friends" -- tales filled with the lessons that would become part of his own life story. He collected these bits of wisdom for more than forty years in the fiveand-dime and then passed them along to his family. He instilled in us the value and importance of EVERY individual and the joy in connecting with new people. There will be 70 vendors selling sewn, knitted and crocheted clothing for infants, children, and adults, as well as hats, tote bags, blankets, kitchen items, jewelry, ceramics, home and holiday decorations, and many other items you won't want to miss. Proceeds will go to the Senior Center Foundation for the benefit of the San Ramon Senior Center and senior programs.

#### **REMINDER:**

The next ACI Large/Bulky Item Trash collection date for Sunny Glen is Friday, November 4th. They take up to 3 cubic yards (3' x 3' x 9') of materials, up to 4 auto tires (no rims) and up to 2 bulky items per house (furniture, mattress, etc.). No single item should weigh over 200 pounds. (Leave at the curbside in front of your home the night before)

They will take yard trimmings and clean wood (up to 6" in diameter, must be tied into bundles no longer than 4 feet long. They take E-waste and large appliances, such as TVs, electronica and kitchen appliances. Place items within 3 feet of the curb by 6a.m. on trash day. Please Do Not Drop These Items Off At The Clubhouse!
