Sunny Glen Going Green: Our New Digital Chapter

Please note that this will be our final printed newsletter. Starting in April 2026, we are moving to an electronic format to better serve our community while saving costs, time, and valuable natural resources. This digital shift makes it easier for members to locate past issues and offers a more convenient way to stay connected. You can access future updates via email (for members with an address on file), on our website at sunnyglen-community.org, or by viewing the hard copy posted on the Clubhouse Lobby bulletin board.

CC&R and Bylaws Voting:

We need member votes for this important process to move forward!

For the past three years, the Sunny Glen Senior Community Board has worked diligently to modernize our governing documents. Our current CC&Rs and Bylaws are now outdated and no longer align with the Davis-Stirling Act or current California state statutes. To ensure our community remains legally compliant and effectively managed, these updates are essential. The proposed documents were drafted by a premier HOA law firm and have received full Board approval. However, we cannot finalize this transition without your participation.

Voting Requirements & Impact:

To move forward, we must meet the following thresholds:

160 total ballots must be received before they can be opened and tallied.

115 "YES" votes are required for the CC&Rs and Bylaws to pass.

Why Your Vote Matters:

If we do not reach these numbers, the process must restart from the beginning. This would result in significant, unnecessary expenses for the community—including legal fees and the cost of reprinting and redistributing mailing packets—all of which are funded by the membership. Furthermore, operating under obsolete documents creates avoidable legal risks for our association.

Please help us protect our community's resources by submitting your ballot today.

Excessive cars on the streets in our community:

We have observed an increasing number of vehicles parked long-term on our community streets, particularly near Wisteria St., Carlisle Ct., Tangerine St., and Tangerine Ct... As a reminder, Sunny Glen is a senior community where residential streets are not to be used for storing vehicles or operating automotive businesses. All residents must adhere to city ordinances regarding street parking limits to avoid being tagged and towed. We kindly ask that you relocate any stored vehicles to your driveway or an appropriate off-site facility to ensure our streets remain clear and accessible for all neighbors.

On Saturday, March 28th, teams from the Danville-San Ramon Rotary Club will visit the homes of seniors who need assistance to install FREE Smoke/Carbon Monoxide Alarms or change batteries in their existing smoke and carbon monoxide alarms and replace smoke alarms as needed.
